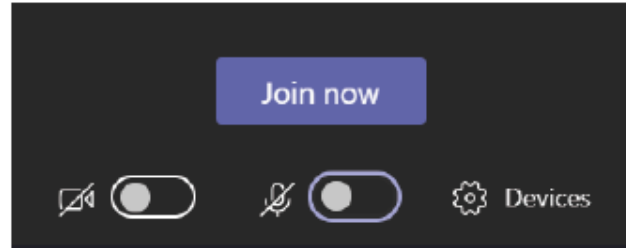

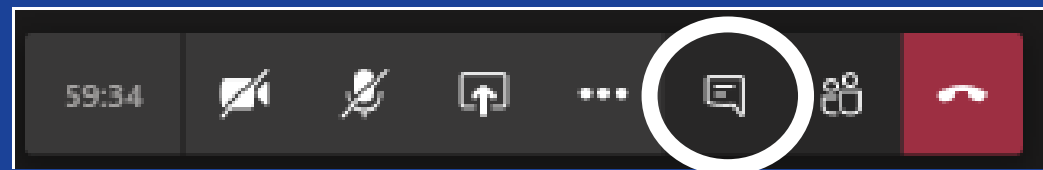

Lisa Torry Smith Act (SB 1055)

- Striking and injuring a vulnerable user in a crosswalk is a misdemeanor
- Striking and seriously injuring or killing a vulnerable user is a felony
- Signed into law June 18, effective as of September 1
- What opportunities are available to outreach and spread the word around the new law?
