





TRAIN STOP APPROACH TO BIKEWAY DESIGN




- 1.2 miles, 10' asphalt, \$450,000 using Pct. 4

- Cyclist fatality on Hwy 6 at Briar Forest in 2022.
 Parallel SH6 priority high injury network segment.
 Desire line exists on trail route.
- On border of COH Dist. F on west and G on east. Entire scope and surroundings Pct. 4. No special districts.




