Applicant Request: Name the following corridors of existing and future bicycle facilities after past Planning & Development Director Patrick "Pat" Walsh


**Applicant Justification:** Acknowledge Pat Walsh's service to the City of Houston and his dedication to active transportation.

- Planning Director from 2014-2018
- Led adoption of City's first general plan (Plan Houston) and the Houston Bike Plan, the first update to the bicycle master plan in 24 years

- 25+ letters of support from residents and agencies





- Almeda Rd (Holly Hall St to Herman Park/Brays Bayou
- Alumni Dr/Kent St from Rice U. to Bissonnet St
- Woodhead St from Bissonnet St to W. Clay St
- Jackson Hill St/Blossom
   St/Patterson St from Buffalo Bayou
   to White Oak Bayou
- Nicholson St from MKT Trail to 26<sup>th</sup> St

**Staff Process:** Evaluate the proposal and assess appropriateness in accordance with Executive Order 1-47, *Naming of City Facilities* 

Used to rename any City-owned facilities after individuals who made exceptional contributions to the City of Houston. First request for a facility in the right-of-way.

#### **Assessment Criteria:**


- Geography
- Appropriateness
- Exceptional contributions to the City
- Well-defined connection associated between the individual's contributions and the City facility.

After assessment, appropriate staff will present findings to the Mayor's Office, collect public comment regarding the proposed naming, and provide a recommendation for consideration by the City Council.

Recommended Staff Alternative: Name the segment of the existing high-comfort bicycle facility on Woodhead St, from Vassar Street to Westheimer Rd the Pat Walsh Bikeway.

#### **Justification for Change:**

- The bikeway on Woodhead is an *existing facility*.
- Well-defined connection between Pat Walsh and Montrose, the neighborhood Pat lived in and where his family currently resides.

- 7 new locations since last report


